



2024 Bursary Application Form

The St Ursula's College Bursary will, generally, be awarded to young women whose family, without financial assistance, would not otherwise be able to afford a St Ursula's College education for their daughter.

A commitment to the Ursuline ethos is fundamental to all that a St Ursula's College education offers. This commitment might be demonstrated through the involvement of the student in the co-curricular life of the College such as but not limited to social justice groups or leadership through the Student Representative Council.

The St Ursula's College Bursary program is open to prospective and current students to enable students to commence or continue their schooling at St Ursula's College.

The Bursary program is a means-tested, application-based program. The recipient must meet all eligibility criteria to be considered for the awarding of a bursary.

The Principal must be satisfied that the student's family shows demonstrable need and holds inability to afford a St Ursula's College education.

Minimum eligibility criteria:

- Copies of the previous year's taxation return; a statement of asset, liabilities, income and expenditure for the previous 12 months; bank statements not more than 12 months in issue and/or government agency payment information.
- The student and her family will attend an interview with the Principal.
- Student will be enrolled at the College for no less than one year.
- Commitment to the academic and/or cocurricular learning, expectations of the College.
- Student is committed to the 'Serviam' motto (I will serve).
- Commitment to involvement in College life.
- Adherence to all aspects of the Student Code of Behaviour.
- Student is an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia.

Bursaries are awarded annually. A Bursary awarded for a period longer than one year will be subject to annual review by the Principal and Business Manager. A successful Bursary recipient who wishes to have the Bursary extended must reapply annually.

The Bursary amount is not paid by any means to the student or parent/guardian. The monies are credited to the account of the student.

At the Principal's discretion, a Bursary may also cover uniforms, co-curricular activities, levies and any other College charges or day to day expenses.

A Bursary may be immediately revoked by the Principal should the student of the family be found to not abide by the rules of the College, including attendance and leave expectations, the College's requirements in relation to Code of Behaviour, Information Technologies Use and the College Uniform Policy.

In the event of cancellation of a Bursary, an appeal may be made in writing to the Principal outlining the reasons for appeal.
